#### Sustainability in supporting a loved one living with Dementia

Speaking with some experience on this subject I feel that I am in a position to assist families who are supporting a loved one who has a progressive decline in cognition.

How we have all tried to support/cope with the ever changing personality of a loved one without a though of how we might sustain this going forward

When someone we live with loses their memory/cognition we attempt to find ways of supporting this in a way that will "help" that person.

We tend to, without even realizing, take control of the situation as this makes us feel good about "making a difference" ......but hang on a minute. Did any of us even consider how we could possibly sustain this in the long run. Of course we didn't. We were "helping" and, as I am sure many of you will be able to relate, we were quite possibly making things much worse.

Before we know we are organizing their day down to the single minute to ensure that everything is taken care of. Getting up at 07:30, wash and dress, medication at 08:00, breakfast at 08:30, doctors at 11:00, tea and cake etc. etc. and the list becomes endless to the point that every day is a Military exercise in management of the situation, which, actually, we the carers have created in the first place.

Instead of the loved one being assisted to help themselves, we find that we are doing everything for them to the point that not only can they no longer cope with doing anything themselves, as we have taken away their skills, they see us as interfering and unwanted in the process.

In amongst all of this attempt to be "helpful" we tend to forget the person, and see them from a carers point of view. Relationships break down as our loved one becomes more and more frustrated by our "help" which they see as out of the ordinary and unwanted.

We as the carers feel rejected and equally frustrated with the apparent lack of gratitude for our efforts and before you know it resentment sets in and the relationship is finished as we know it.

This is the point that we often resort to seeking the assistance of professionals, and in some circumstances a residential setting. We attempt to assure the staff that the detailed daily routine which we have painstakingly written down on paper is the ONLY way we they will cope with him/her. However our instructions are utterly unsustainable in any setting, let alone a residential home where there are another 40-50 residents with just the same complex needs.

Hope is not lost though, as quite often, and at Norwood House this is even more prevalent, once the regimental aspect of the residents daily lives are stripped down and they are encouraged to lead fulfilled lives and , wherever possible and safe to do so THEY are in control, they often settle down and live very happily in a residential setting.

Family members are overjoyed at how content their loved one is.

However the key should always be that people living with dementia must not be drawn into a life that is controlled by others as they will "fight against" this, as it is human nature to do so. Especially when they have lost the insight to understand that sometimes we are just **"helping"**




