
Memory walk is a sponsored walk for all ages and abilities to unite together to raise money to defeat dementia.

A VERY POPULAR VISITOR ...



Mini 'Pumpkin' Pizzas

Makes 8 / Takes 50 Minutes

INGREDIENTS

- 60g pizza pepperoni
- 80g grated mozzarella
- 100g tomato pizza sauce
- 15g fresh basil leaves
- 2 x 280g packs ready-rolled pizza dough
- * 1 egg yolk


METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan, and put a large baking tray inside
- 2. Chop pepperoni and mix with mozzarella, tomato sauce and basil
- 3. Unroll pizza bases and cut into quarters
- 4. Put 1/8 of the tomato mixture into the centre of each triangle. Bring the sides up and over the filling and press to seal. Trim the excess dough to make a ball
- 5. Cut 8x1-metre pieces of kitchen string. Create the pumpkin effect by tying the string around each ball like a parcel, looping it around 4 times to make 8 segments
- 6. Pull the string just tight enough so the dough bulges slightly, tie the ends and trim
- Mix the egg yolk and paprika in a bowl and brush all over the pumpkins. Put them on the hot tray, seal-side down, and bake for 20 minutes. Flip and bake for a further 10 minutes.
- 8. Run a knife under the pumpkins to free them from the tray. Allow to cool for 5 minutes before snipping the string off. Make a stalk using basil leaves or halved pecan nuts.






Potato Facts...
